AN ANALYSIS OF METAPHOR IN GRIMM BROTHERS SHORT STORIES

ABSTRACT

In this research, the writer analyzes kind of metaphors in Grimm Brothers' short stories. The writer also tries to explain the meaning of metaphor. The data comes from the Grimm Brothers' short stories that the writer has selected. The writer also utilizes a qualitative method to analyze, as well as several techniques to collect data, including: reading a short story as the first step, identifying words related to metaphor as the second step, and classifying each metaphor based on Ullman's theory, and then analyze the data in this study using Beekman and Callow's theory as the final step. The results of this study showed there are 12 Anthropomorphic Metaphor, 15 Animal Meatphor, 11 Metaphor from Concrete to Abstract, and 13 Synaesthetic Metaphor. Therefore, The writer discovered no prevailing type in the short stories. Furthermore, the meaning from each metaphor can be interpreted through the existing context.

Animal metaphor is a metaphor that uses animals or part of animal body or something related to animals for imaging something else, one of the examples found in the source of the data is is taken from Hansel and grethel. But Grethel saw what she had in her mind, and said, "I do not know how I am to do it; how do you get in?" "You stupid goose," said the old woman, "The door is big enough; just look, I can get in myself!" and she crept up and thrust her head into the oven. The next type is metaphor from concrete to abstract, a metaphor which arising from the transformation of an experience from concrete to abstract or vice versa, one of the examples found in the source of the data is taken from Hansel and Grethel. "Nibble, nibble, gnaw, Who is nibbling at my little house?" The children answered, "The wind, the wind, The heaven-born wind," and went on eating without disturbing themselves. The last type is Synaesthetic metaphor a metaphor based on the transfer of responses, particularly the transfer of responses from one sense to another, one of the examples of this type is taken from Rapunzel, This was Rapunzel, who in her solitude passed her time in letting her sweet voice resound. This metaphor implies that Rapunzel had a pleasant or pleasing voice.
