TEACHING VOCABULARY THROUGH VISUAL AND VERBAL TECHNIQUE

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The aim of this paper is to describe how to teach vocabulary by using visual and verbal technique. Visual technique includes flash cards, photographs, wall charts, blackboard drawing and relia. These techniques concern with visual memory. Verbal technique includes synonym, antonym, definition and example. Visual and Verbal technique can make teaching and learning more interesting and students will understand the meaning of the vocabulary easier. The procedures of teaching vocabulary by using visual and verbal technique are preparation, pre-teaching, whilst teaching and post teaching. In preparation, the teacher prepares the material, media and lesson plan. In whilst teaching, the teacher implements the visual and verbal technique and shows of the picture related to synonym, antonym and definition of the word. The last, in post-teaching, the teacher concludes the lesson and gives the task to the students in order to know whether the students understand or not about the material given.

The Concept of Vocabulary

Vocabulary is the total number of words which establish a language (Hornby, 1974:959). Further, he states that in order to make up the language, such words should be combined by using certain rules. Furthermore, Ellen (1997:149)

says that vocabulary is an important part in language teaching and should be learned continually by the students. It means vocabulary is the basic need that must haved by the students themselves.

Teaching Vocabulary

There are several suggestions related to teaching vocabulary, one of the explanations as is stated by Doff (1989). He states 'some ways of presenting vocabulary or techniques for teaching new words. They are as follows:

- a. Introduce the words by using media or real object.
- Say the word clearly practice
 and write it on the board.
- c. Get the class to repeat the word in chorus.
- d. Give an English example to show how the word is used.

e. Ask questions using the new word.

Visual and Verbal Technique in Teaching Vocabulary

Visual Techniques

Concerning with the visual techniques, Gairns and Redman (1980) say that "there are three forms visual techniques; "realia, pictures, and mime or gestures." Realia means using a variety of real-object brought by the students in the classroom. It can be also applied to remember written material. Students can act out what they read, or associate physical sensation with specific words found in reading passages.

Verbal Techniques

Marla in Ajabshir (2011) divides verbal techniques into four parts, among those are:

a. Definition and illustration sentences,

the English teachers introduce a word in English through the use of other word in the same language.

example:

- b. Synonyms and antonyms;
- . Synonyms are words that have the same meaning as the unknown in a given sentence. There may be signals that identify the presence synonym for the readers. They could be or, commas, dashes, and colons. Meanwhile, antonyms words that have the opposite meaning of the unknown word in a given sentence. Signals which identify the presence of the antonyms for readers are instead, although, but, yet, and however.

Examples of synonym:

• Happy : Joyful

• Intelligent : Smart

• Unhappy : Sad

Examples of antonym:

• Hot = Cold

• Fat = Skinny

c. Scale; This technique is the presentation of related words in scales that include the combination of both verbal and visual techniques, for example, in term 32° Celsius, the degree sign is the visual.

d. Explanation; this technique explains the meaning and the use of a foreign word in the foreign language itself.

Advantages of Visual Techniques

Ajabshir (2011) states the advantages of visual techniques are:

- a. students remember
 vocabulary easier that has
 been presented by visual
 technique.
- b. Visual techniques help
 students associated presented
 vocabulary in meaningful
 way.
- c. Students can visualize what the word means and related the word to actual object.
- d. Visual techniques facilitate recall of vocabulary that word do not alone.

Advantages of Verbal Techniques

Ajabshir (2011) describes the advantages of verbal techniques are :

- Verbal techniques allow
 students to learn word
 effectively in different aspect.
- b. Learning synonyms of known
 words may be faster, because
 students may gain large

amount of vocabulary knowledge from known synonym.

c. Learning by using verbal technique will develop students' memories. should make an attractive media in teaching. So, students can enjoy the material. They will not feel bored and can respect to teacher's explanation.

- The teacher asks the students to guess the English name of the pictures that is based on their background knowledge.
- The teacher says the correct name of the pictures and explains it.





